



COVID-19 Operational Plan Summary

- There will be a maximum of 90 campers each week. These campers will be split into pods of up to 15 campers and 4 counselors. Physical distancing will not be required within the pod however, they will not come into close contact with all other pods during the week.
- Upon arrival, all campers will be screened for COVID-19 using a survey suggested by GNB, and they will have their temperature taken using a contactless thermometer. Any camper showing two or more symptoms will not be permitted to attend camp.
- Drop off and pick up will happen on the mainland at scheduled times. Due to our revised visitor policy, we are asking that parents do not travel to the Island. Counselors will welcome the campers on the mainland and boat over with them.
- Essential visitors will be screened, will wash their hands upon arrival, and will be required to wear a mask if physical distancing is not possible. Non-essential visitors must have permission from the Camp Director to visit the island.
- The frequency of sanitization will be increased. All general locations which are frequently touched such as doorknobs and handles will be cleaned a minimum of twice daily. All activity equipment will be cleaned after each pod use. It will be ensured that all people on site wash their hands frequently. All hand washing stations will have signs posted demonstrating the proper hand washing techniques.
- Campers will be educated and will be expected to follow the new protocols. These expectations will be addressed on arrival day as well as each morning and reminded throughout the day.
- During mealtimes, pods will go through the serving line separately and eat at designated areas in the dining hall to ensure physical distancing. Campers can bring snacks in their luggage; however, our kitchen facilities are off limits as a storage area for camper food. Campers with food allergies and/or intolerances will have accommodated meals if we are made aware of the allergies/intolerances a minimum of one week in advance.
- All kitchen staff and food servers will be trained and aware of all health and safety measures such as increased hand washing, wearing gloves and excluding themselves if feeling ill.
- Campers and staff will be screened daily. If they show 2 or more symptoms, we will contact home for parents to pick them up. Camper refunds will be processed accordingly.
- Between each camp session, all areas will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized prior to a new group of campers arriving.



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
